Delhi court summons filmmaker

NEW DELHI: A district court here has issued summons to filmmaker Leena Manimekalai and others for August 6, in a suit seeking an interim injunction to restrain them from depicting Hindu goddess Kaali in their latest film poster, video, and tweet "in a very uncalled way".



The plea moved by Advocate Raj Gaurav, contended that the poster of the film depicts the goddess smoking cigarettes which not only hurts the religious sentiments of common Hindus but is also against the basics of morality and decency.

AGNIPATH SCHEME

'REBEL' CONG LEADER REFUSES TO SIGN OPPOSITION'S LETTER

Ahead of the Monsoon Session of Parliament, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh gave a presentation to the Parliamentary Consultative Committee



NEW DELHI: Congress MP Manish Tewari on Monday refused to sign the Opposition's protest letter on the Agnipath recruitment scheme, reported NDTV.

Tiwari, who is a part of the Consultative Committee for Defence in Parliament, had said the Agnipath scheme is a much-needed reform in the right direction.

"I do empathise with youth who have concerns over Agnipath recruitment Process. Reality is India needs a younger armed force with lighter human footprint savvy on technology, equipped with state of art weaponry. Armed forces of Union shouldn't be an employment guarantee programme," he had also said in a tweet.

The letter, listing a set of demands, was signed by six opposition MPs including Congress's Shaktisinh Gohil, Trinamool Congress's Sudip Bandyopadhyay and Sougata Roy, Nationalist Congress Party's Supriya Sule and Rashtriya Janata Dal's AD Singh.

Withdrawal sought

NEW DELHI: Opposition MPs raised concerns about the newly launched Agnipath recruitment scheme for the armed forces.



"It was a very good meeting", Rajnath Singh told ANI after the meeting. However, the opposition parties expressed their reservations about the Agnipath scheme.

They spoke about "huge unemployment" in the country being the reason for the large

number of applications for the scheme. "The Opposition said the fact that people have applied in large numbers for the scheme is significant as there is huge unemployment in the country and asked why the government was not addressing it?" said the sources.

"The Army is responsible for the security and safety, what if he or she compromise the security of the country," added the sources.

FCRA BRIBERY CASE

CBI files charge sheet against arrested MHA officials, NGO reps

NEW DELHI: The CBI has filed a charge sheet against Home Ministry officials, NGO representatives and others arrested two months ago for allegedly running a bribery ring that helped NGOs receive foreign funds in violation of India's exchange law, officials said Monday.

The charge sheet has been filed within 60 days of the arrests made on May 11, the officials said.

Had the CBI missed the 60-day deadline the arrested accused would have become eligible for default bail by a special court, the officials said. It was alleged that several officials were allegedly involved in exchanging bribes for facilitating clearances of foreign donations to the NGOs in alleged violation of Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) rules.

The agency had registered the case on May 10 against 36 people including seven officials of the Home Ministry's FCRA division and National Informatics Centre, some middlemen, and NGO representatives on a complaint from the ministry.

The next day, the agency had arrested 14 people including six serving officials of the ministry after searches at 40 locations in a countrywide crackdown. The agency has not included the names of two arrested accused in the charge sheet as the probe has been kept open, they said. Those arrested included MHA officials Senior Accountant Pramod Kumar Bhasin, Accounts Officer Alok Ranjan, Accountant Raj Kumar, Assistant Director Shaheed Khan, MHA officer Mohammed Gazanfar Ali and Tushar Kanti Roy.

MOOSEWALA MURDER CASE

SC refuses to entertain plea to transfer case to CBI

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Monday refused to entertain Punjab BJP leader Jagjit Singh's plea seeking to transfer the investigation in the Sidhu Moosewala murder case to the CBI.

A bench of justices Ajay Rastogi and Abhay S. Oka also remarked that such matters should not be given any political colour and they don't appreciate such practice. However, the Court also remarked that the court has to work openly for all the people. Meanwhile, the Court adjourned to July 18 hearing on another plea of accused Lawrence Bishnoi's father challenging the transit remand to Punjab police and asked the Punjab state to file a reply on the plea. Advocate Vikram Chaudhri, appeared for the father of gangster Bishnoi while senior advocate AM Singhvi appeared for Punjab. On June 14, the Patiala House Court of Delhi allowed Punjab Police to arrest Gangster Lawrence Bishnoi in connection with Singer Sidhu Moosewala murder case and also allowed Punjab Police to ensure that the medical examination of accused Bishnoi be conducted as per law/rules before leaving Delhi and also before his production before the concerned Court of CJM, Mansa, Punjab.

OPS pulled up for rushing to court

EPS is new boss

CHENNAI: In a day of dramatic developments in the AIADMK, Edappadi K Palaniswami (EPS) was elected its interim general secretary and O Panneerselvam (OPS) was expelled from the primary membership. The party office were also "sealed" by the revenue authorities following a clash between their supporters on Monday.

AIADMK facing its biggest challenge in the absence of charismatic leaders at the helm. It is likely to witness further turmoil when OPS, miserably outnumbered in popular support within the party, drags the affairs to the courts and the ECI. The day began with OPS, who is opposed to migrating to unitary leadership, heading to the AIADMK headquarters in Royapettah in Chennai. His arrival triggered clashes between his supporters and those of former chief minister Palaniswami. He entered the headquarters after his supporters broke open the doors and stayed put. Meanwhile, the Madras HC gave green signal for the party executive and general council meeting, which OPS had challenged, just 15 minutes before the event was scheduled to begin.

ZUBAIR MOVES SESSIONS COURT FOR BAIL

NEW DELHI: Alt News co-founder Mohammed Zubair has moved a bail application in sessions court at the Patiala House courts, seeking bail in the case related to an "objectionable tweet" allegedly posted by him against a Hindu deity. The plea will be heard on Tuesday. On July 2, Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Snigdha Sarvaria at the Patiala House Courts rejected the bail plea of Zubair in connection with the case and granted his 14-day custody as sought by the Delhi Police. "Since the matter is at the initial stage of investigation and given the overall facts and circumstances of the case and nature and gravity of the offences alleged against the accused, no ground for grant of bail is made out," Sarvaria said while dismissing Zubair's bail plea.
