SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) Police on the basis of a specific intelligence input busted a terror module of the Hizbul Mujahideen (HM) in North Kashmir's Kupwara on Monday night and arrested a terrorist with four of his associates. Police said acting on information about cross-LoC smuggling of a large quantity of weapons, their storage by the terror associates of the Hizbul Mujahideen outfit and their delivery to active terrorists, a joint operation was carried out on Monday evening by the police, Army and the CRPF.

Toll in Kerala landslide rises to 52 as 3 more bodies recovered

IDUKKI: The toll in the landslide in Pettimudi in the high range Idukki district rose to 52 with three more bodies being recovered from the debris as rescue operations continued on Tuesday to trace those missing. The bodies of two men and a woman were recovered, officials said. Personnel of NDRF, Fire, Forest and police departments have expanded their search operations to the downstream of a river in their efforts to trace 19 more people who were still missing in the August 7 tragedy near Rajamala, they said.

Online yoga sessions for Tamil Nadu prisoners

COIMBATORE: Inmates of central prisons across Tamil Nadu are attending yoga classes online to remain healthy and beat the coronavirus during the COVID-19 lockdown period. Considering the request from Tamil Nadu Prisons Department, Isha Yoga Centre is conducting the virtual sessions for inmates at almost all central prisons in the state from July 28. Isha teachers trained by the centre's founder Sadhguru Jaggi Vasudev, are delivering the online modules in Tamil to participants in Chennai, Vellore, Cuddalore, Tiruchirappalli, Salem and Palayamkottai.

Telangana mulls taking over 50% of beds in private hospitals

HYDERABAD: Taking a serious note of people's complaints against private hospitals treating Covid-19 patients, the Telangana government is mulling to take over 50 per cent of their beds, by exercising powers under the Epidemic Disease Act. With over 1,000 complaints against private hospitals regarding Covid-19 treatment charges, Health Minister E. Rajender has directed officials to prepare plans to take over 50 per cent of beds, including ICU beds, and to offer treatment as per government terms, if the managements of the private hospitals do not mend their ways.

Institute seeks govt support to boost Pearl Spot production

KOCHI: The Chennai headquartered Central Institute of Brackishwater Aquaculture (ICAR-CIBA) has sought the support of the Kerala government to boost the aquaculture production of one of the most sought after fish in the state -- Pearl Spot known as Karimeen in local parlance. Karimeen has always been much in demand, especially among foreign tourists. The popular tourist destination of Kumarakom is known for the availability of this fish in the Vemband lake. Kumarakom shot into prominence after then Prime Minister A B Vajpayee spent his Christmas holidays there two decades back.

Hyderabad police remove provocative banner after protest

HYDERABAD: The Hyderabad police has removed a controversial banner with provocative writing from a busy traffic intersection in the city after its display went viral on social media. The banner was put up by an organization called Bhagat Singh Yuva Sena at Moazzam Jahi Market crossroads in the heart of the city. It was installed by one Laddu Yadav to thank Prime Minister Narendra Modi for the Ram temple in Ayodhya and for Independence Day greetings. It carried pictures of the Prime Minister, Union minister of state for home G Kishan Reddy, BJP MLA Raja Singh and Laddu Yadav. However the writings on the hoarding were provocative.

Let's not equate Hindi with nationalism: S M Krishna

BENGALURU: "Not knowing Hindi will not make you less Indian", veteran politician and former External Affairs Minister, S M Krishna said as he expressed dismay over what DMK MP Kanimozhi faced at the Chennai airport. Hindi is another Indian language and nothing more, the BJP leader and former Karnataka Chief Minister said in a statement on Tuesday. "Let's not equate Hindi with nationalism", added the former Maharashtra Governor. Kanimozhi had said she was asked whether or not she was an Indian after she told a CISF official at the airport to speak in Tamil or English as she did not understand Hindi.

A salute in honour of good samaritans lands Kerala policeman in trouble

A salute by a police officer to groups of volunteers who helped in evacuating the Air India Express plane crash victims here has landed him in trouble with an enquiry being ordered into his conduct. Nizar, a senior civil police officer of the control room here, had saluted the young volunteers, who had participated in the rescue operations on Friday and are now in quarantine at Kondotty here. A photograph of the police officer's gesture has gone viral on social media. Malappuram District police chief U Abdul Kareem said the policeman, who was deployed at the airport to ensure public do not crowd at the place of the mishap site, visited two quarantine centres on his own. An enquiry has been ordered and a report expected in two days' time. But there was no possibility of taking any stringent action against Nizar, he told PTI. "There is no protocol as to who all a policeman can and cannot salute. Hence, the act of the police personnel cannot be regarded as illegal," the SP said. Malappuram district collector K Gopalakrishnan has also said the policeman's act should be condoned. Many netizens also have also come out in support of Nizar. The volunteers had rushed to the accident spot unmindful of the heavy rains and Covid-19 fears and the injured were taken immediately to various hospitals, thus saving many lives, drawing praise from various quarters, including Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan. The Air India Express has also acknowledged their role in evacuating the passengers. "We at Air India Express take a bow to the people of Malappuram who have risked their own lives to save many. WE OWE YOU!" the airline had tweeted.

Supreme Court backs women's right in parental property

SC: Once a daughter, always a daughter

Holding that daughters cannot be deprived of their right of equality, the Supreme Court Tuesday ruled that they will have equal coparcenary rights in joint Hindu family property even if the father died before the Hindu Succession (Amendment) Act 2005. A bench of Justices Arun Mishra, S Nazeer and M R Shah said the provisions contained in substituted Section 6 of the Hindu Succession Act, 1956 confer the status of coparcener on the daughter born before or after amendment in the same manner as a son with the same rights and liabilities. The verdict makes it clear the amendment to the Hindu Succession Act, 1956 granting equal rights to daughters to inherit ancestral property would have retrospective effect. The top court, which overruled its earlier 2015 decision in which it had held that the rights under the amendment



are applicable to living daughters of living coparceners as on September 9, 2005, irrespective of when such daughters are born, also observed that "a daughter always remains a loving daughter". It also quoted its earlier judgement and said "A son is a son until he gets a wife. A daughter is a daughter throughout her life." The three-judge bench Tuesday said, "The rights can be claimed by the daughter born earlier with effect from September 9, 2005 with savings as provided in Section 6(1) as to the disposition or alienation, partition or testamentary disposition which had taken place before December 20, 2004. Since the right in coparcenary is by birth, it is not necessary that father coparcener should be living as on September 9, 2005." Coparcener is a term used for a person who assumes a legal right in parental property by birth only. The apex court, in its 121-page judgement, said the statutory fiction of partition created by proviso to Section 6 of the Hindu Succession Act, 1956 as originally enacted did not bring about the actual partition or disruption of coparcenary. "The fiction was only for the purpose of ascertaining share of deceased coparcener when he was survived by a female heir, of Class -I as specified in the Schedule to the Act of 1956 or male relative of such female. "The provisions of the substituted Section 6 are required to be given full effect. Notwithstanding that a preliminary decree has been passed the daughters are to be given share in coparcenary equal to that of a son in pending proceedings for final decree or in an appeal," the bench said.

60-yr-old woman Covid patient dies in ambulance as family couldn't pay admission fee

A 60-year-old female coronavirus patient died in an ambulance outside a private hospital in Kolkata while allegedly awaiting admission as her family failed to deposit in time Rs 3 lakh demanded by the staff. The family hails from Tamaluk in East Midnapore district and were asked to deposit Rs 3 lakh demanded by the staff at Desun hospital on EM bypass but they failed to arrange for the money on time. The deceased woman's son slammed the hospital and termed his mother's death a murder by the hospital and not due to the coronavirus. "My mother was not well, she had cardiac issues for a long time. We brought her to another hospital in Kolkata first and when she was tested positive for Covid. She had to be shifted to a Covid-19 facility, hence we

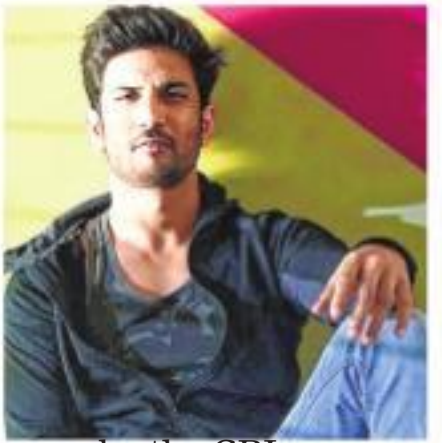
went to Desun," said Lajim Khan. He said they immediately deposited Rs 80,000 and asked for an hour to arrange the remaining amount. But, they alleged, the hospital authorities categorically told them that doctors would not be able to start treatment unless the full payment was made. Later, they arranged Rs 2 lakh more and deposited the amount in a bank account, but the patient had died by then in the ambulance. Despite repeated attempts, hospital authorities refused to issue any media statement on the issue. The West Bengal Clinical Establishment Regulatory Commission has issued an advisory to cap advance deposit during admission as Rs 50,000 after repeated incidents coming to light of exorbitant amounts charged by hospitals in the state. "Chief Minister Mamata

Banerjee has clearly given instructions to all private medical facilities not to delay treatment in such emergencies. This is absolutely uncalled for," IMA president MP Shantanu Sen said.

Who probes Sushant's death: CBI or Mumbai police?

SC KEEPS UP THE SUSPENSE

The Supreme Court kept up the suspense on who should probe actor Sushant Singh Rajput's death -- the CBI or the Mumbai Police -- by reserving the order after two hours of hearing. The single-judge Bench of Justice Hrishikesh Roy gave a day's time till Wednesday to the Centre, Maharashtra and Bihar governments, actress Rhea Chakraborty and the late actor's father to file written notes on their submissions. Wednesday being a holiday on account of Janmashtami, they have time till Thursday morning to do the needful. The judge was hearing a petition of Rhea Chakraborty, seeking transfer of investigation initiated in Patna on the basis of FIR lodged by Rajput's father, to Mumbai police. However, since then the investigation in Patna FIR has been taken

over by the CBI. During the hearing, the Mumbai Police raised the issue of jurisdiction while the Bihar government and Sushant's father alleged bias on part of the former, contending that there is a strong case for an independent probe by a central agency. Hammering the point of jurisdiction which gave Mumbai police the right to investigate the case, senior counsel Abhishek Manu Singhvi, appearing for Maharashtra government, said, "You may have screaming headlines, screaming anchors, comments from everywhere but that does not change the law. The court should look at the law. It's not about Mumbai police and Bihar police. It's about federalism and jurisdiction." Referring to Section 6 of the Delhi Special Police Establishment Act, which mandates prior consent of the State government for CBI to take over the investigation of a case, Singhvi said, "The only exception to state consent is if and when the Supreme Court comes to a conclusion that there are 'extraordinary circumstances,' as then alone it (Supreme Court) can transfer an investigation to the CBI." Dealing with the aspect of territorial jurisdiction, senior counsel Maninder Singh, appearing for the Bihar government, said: "It cannot be said that Bihar does not have territorial jurisdiction to investigate the case." His logic was that "when it is uncertain where exactly the offence was committed, the issue of territorial jurisdiction does not arise and moreover proceedings of investigation cannot be challenged on grounds of territorial jurisdiction."

Covid victim's family asked to pay Rs 50K to see body

KOLKATA: The family members of a Covid-19 victim on Tuesday alleged that they were asked to pay Rs 51,000 to catch a glimpse of their departed relative at a crematorium in Howrah district. The incident took place at the Shibpur burning ghat along the Ganga when the family members of Hari Om Gupta requested the corporation officials to allow them to see the deceased's face once before the cremation.

BJP FUNCTIONARY SHOT DEAD IN UP

BAGHPAT/LUCKNOW: A Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) functionary was shot dead in Uttar Pradesh's Baghat district on Tuesday morning, police said. Sanjay Khokhar, a former district unit president of the BJP, was out for a morning walk when the incident took place, the police said. Chief Minister Adityanath condoleed Khokhar's death and directed officials to take action against the guilty within 24 hours. Sanjay Khokhar (52), a resident of Tilwara area of the district was going towards his tubewell in the morning when he was shot dead by some criminals.

LJP against Bihar polls on schedule

Election Commission of India has started preparations for the Bihar assembly elections to be conducted on schedule. Term of the present assembly ends on November 29 and elections may be held in different phases between October-November. Ruling NDA partner, LJP has opposed holding elections on its schedule in view of the Corona crisis. Union food and consumer welfare minister Ram Vilas Paswan, father of LJP president Chirag Paswan, even suggested President's rule should be imposed after the term of the House expired. LJP parliamentary board in a resolution had recommended rescheduling of the elections as the party apprehended holding elections

during Corona crisis may put the lives of millions into danger. All parties, including the RJD, RLSP, VIP HAM(S), Left parties and LJP in their written submissions had demanded extension of election dates in view of Covid pandemic. However, JDU and BJP wanted it on time before the expiry of the term of the present House. Paswan reacted to the announcement of the chief election commissioner, Sunil Arora by saying millions of school teachers would be engaged as polling personnel, thousands of security men would be engaged and crores of electorate would be asked to line up at polling centres, all within the danger zone of Corona virus. Health services in Bihar are still off the mark to fight Corona, LJP leader said.

1. The above consolidated Ind AS financial results of the Group have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors of the Holding Company at their respective meetings held on 11 August 2020.
 2. The Group has determined 'Snacks Food' as a reportable segment as evaluated by the chief operating decision maker for allocation of resources and assessing the performance. There are no other reportable segment as per Ind AS 108 'Operating Segment'. Accordingly, no separate segment information has been provided.
 3. The figures of the quarter ended 31 March 2020 are balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the unaudited published year-to-date figures upto 31 December 2019 which were subjected to limited review.
 4. On account of the spread of COVID-19 virus, the Government of India had imposed a complete nation-wide lockdown on March 24, 2020 leading to shut down of the Group's manufacturing facilities (including contract manufacturing facilities) and operations. During the quarter, the Group has resumed operations at all its manufacturing facilities and is currently in the process of scaling up its operations. As the products manufactured by the Group are covered under essential services, management believes the impact is likely to be less significant. Management believes that the pandemic is not likely to impact the recoverability of the carrying value of its assets. Management is closely monitoring the developments and possible effects that may result from the current pandemic on its financial condition, liquidity and operations and is actively working to minimize the impact of this unprecedented situation. As the situation is continuously evolving, the eventual impact may be different from the estimates made as of the date of approval of these consolidated Ind AS financial results.
 5. The Nomination and Remuneration Committee of the Board of Directors of the Holding Company at its meeting held on 9 August 2019 have granted 3,47,000 Stock Appreciation Rights ('SAR') to eligible employees of the Group under Prataap Employees Stock Appreciation Rights Plan 2018 ('ESAR'). The said grant has already been approved by the shareholders in their Annual General Meeting held on 28 September 2018. Accordingly, the Company has recognised an expense amounting to INR 105.75 lakhs for the quarter ended 31 December 2019, INR 105.75 lakhs and INR 271.59 lakhs for quarter and year ended 31 March 2020 respectively included under employee benefits expense towards SAR granted.
 6. Pursuant to approval of scheme of amalgamation by National Company Law Tribunal, Pure N Sure Food Bites Private Limited (PNSFBPL), a wholly owned subsidiary, has been amalgamated with the Holding Company effective 1 April 2019.
