Trials for cocktail antibodies injection on Covid-19 patients start at Jabalpur

Trials for a cocktail antibodies injection, which costs around Rs 60,000, began on Covid patients at the Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose (NSCB) Medical College, Jabalpur, on Friday. Fifty vials have been supplied to NSCB Medical College for the trials. Mostly

mild and moderate symptomatic Covid patients will be given the dose and their health condition will be minutely monitored. A similar kind of trials will begin at more medical colleges. Preparations are going on at GMC, Bhopal, for the trials. Doctors said that preparations had been made for such trials.

WHAT IS ANTIBODY COCKTAIL?

○ An antibody cocktail is a mix of two or more unique biological drugs that act like human antibodies to help fight off infection
○ The drug comprises two antibodies—casirivimab and imdevimab

Chouhan's strategy to arrest virus works well

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has crafted a strategy to arrest the second wave of Covid-19. As a result of that strategy, the number of corona cases has decreased in the state. The government has sealed the state borders adjacent to Maharashtra to stop the influx of people from there. To deal with the shortage of oxygen cylinders, Air Force planes were used and army hospitals were opened to corona patients.

Chouhan has also announced Rs 5,000 as pension for families who have lost their breadwinners to Covid-19. Not only that, but such families will also get free rations and one of the relatives of those families will get a job on compassionate grounds. He appealed to people to wear masks and to get vaccinated.

Chouhan, however, was not in favour of another long haul of the lockdown, but he had to do that to put the state under corona curfew to break the chain of the virus. He has told the

district administrations to take decisions on the grounds of local conditions. That has helped the government to bring the virus under control.

Chouhan kept away from rallies for the by-election in Damoh and for the state elections in Assam and West Bengal for Covid-19.

A shortage of oxygen and a lack of beds in hospitals were witnessed, but those problems were gradually solved. It was ensured that the state got 500 MT of oxygen daily. The government has also planned to set up oxygen plants. Army hospitals were also opened to corona patients after discussions between the defence minister, Rajnath Singh, and Chouhan.

A large number of Covid-19 centres were open throughout the state and the 'Kill Corona Campaign' was launched. Asha and Anganwadi workers visited every house to identify corona patients and to isolate them. From members of Parliament (MP) to panchsarpanches and other public representatives—all worked together to stop the virus.

From a peak of 13,670 corona-positive cases on April 23, the state recorded a constant decline in the number. On May 10, it dropped to 9,741.

CM urges collectors to reduce positive rate to 5% by May 31

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has asked the collectors to bring down the positivity rate to 5% by May 31 before the unlocking process begins on June 1. The corona positivity rate is still more than 5% in a few districts in the state. It is more than 5% in Bhopal, Indore, Sagar, Ratlam and Anuppur.

According to the central government's guidelines, the districts where the positivity rate is more than 5% should be placed under corona curfew. Containment areas should be set up in

such districts and corona protocols should be strictly followed to check the virus. The unlocking process will not begin on June 1 in districts where the positivity

rate does not fall by May 31. Chouhan has directed the collectors to keep the positive cases in complete isolation to prevent the disease from spreading to other

er areas. The chief minister is worried about the corona-related situation in Bhopal and Indore. In both the districts, the positivity rate is very high. Therefore, it is difficult to say what will happen to these districts on May 31. The figure of positive cases has increased because the number of testing has gone up in these districts, the administrations of which are working towards the formula of reducing the positivity rate through testing. There is more testing in Indore. On Thursday, 8,910 swab samples were tested and 525 positive cases were found.

Examinations for final-year students of all undergraduate courses of Barkatullah University (BU) will begin on June 11. The examinations will be held on the open-book pattern.

BU has become the first university in the state to release its examination schedule for its students. More than 100,000 students are expected to write copies for the final-year UG examinations.

Question papers of all subjects will be uploaded

on BU's website on June 11. Students appearing in the examinations will write the answers sitting in their homes. Students will get time up to June 18 to submit their answer copies. After this, the students will have to submit the answer copies at the collection centres prescribed by BU.

Students have eight days' time to write their answer copies. The question papers are of 50 and 100 marks.

Barkatullah University has uploaded the format of the first page of the answer copy on its website. Students have been given spec-

ifications about the answer copies, as well. According to the instructions, the answer copy should consist of 16 pages. The cover page of the answer copy should be replicated as given on the university's website.

Students from outside Bhopal can send the copies through speed-post to the confidential department at BU. Students have been asked to send their answer copies latest by June 18 through registered post. They have also been asked

to keep their receipts safely. The receipt will remain instrumental in case of any controversy related to the last date, between the student and the university.

Another tiger carcass found in Umaria district

A carcass of a tiger was found in the Ghughuthi area of Umaria district late on Thursday. A team of forest officials reached the spot on Friday morning and took stock of the situation.

CCF PK Verma confirmed the incident and said that the carcass seemed to be a few days old. It was found near Patnar village, in the Ghughuthi forest circle. Villagers reported about the carcass late on Thursday night. A team of forest officials reached there early morning on Friday along with a dog squad and members of the forensic team. The team was still conducting the probe, said the official. CCF Verma said that,

prima facie, it seemed that the tiger had died a natural death. It was around seven years old. The final conclusion on the reason of death would be made

only after the report from the forensic lab was received. Locals have raised fingers on the laxity in patrolling of the forest staff in the region.

Covid patient survives scare as ambulance 'falls ill'

After Harsud, where an old ambulance failed to start ahead of its flagging-off ceremony, Thikri village witnessed a similar incident where an ambulance carrying a Covid-19 patient from Anjad village stopped on its way to Indore.

Incident occurred on Friday morning near Thikri Bypass. Due to non-availability of another ambulance at Thikri community health centre, patient had to wait for more than an hour on the highway. Later, members of Niswarth Seva Samiti from Thikri village called Highway Ambulance



from Dharampuri village, which took more than an hour to reach the spot. According to information, an ambulance with Covid-19 patient from Anjad Community Health Centre started 140-kilometre journey to Indore. After covering 36 kilometres, the ambulance broke down due to mechanical fault. As a result, it stopped near Thikri Bypass. As soon as Niswarth Seva Samiti

members came to know about the incident, they immediately called another ambulance from Dharampuri village. Samiti members also arranged an oxygen facility for the patient. Ambulance driver said he has reported the matter to senior officials. Few days back, former state home minister and Rajpur MLA Bala Bachchan had announced to provide two ambulances for Anjad community health centre. When contacted, Thikri Block Medical Officer Dr ND Tiwari admitted that ambulance is not available. "We have been requesting for ambulance but to no avail. We seek Highway Ambulance in case of emergency," he said.

JAMGHAT FOREST: MONKEYS FEAST ON FRUITS, BISCUITS PROVIDED BY LOCALS
