550 WOMEN KIDNAPPED IN MP DURING TWO MONTHS OF LOCKDOWN

It's ironic and shocking that even complete lockdown in the nation following Covid-19 situation and heavy police presence on roads failed to stop abduction of women in the state.

At the time when people were not permitted to come out of their houses and borders of the districts and states were sealed, more than 550 women were kidnapped in the month of April and May in Madhya Pradesh.

As many as 207 women were abducted in April and 381 in May.

In the year 2019, 9812 women and girls were kidnapped. The number shot down to 6887 women kidnappings but the fact remains that the crime took

place even at the time of nationwide lockdown.

After the relaxation of national lockdown in the month of June, number of women kidnappings shoot up to 624 and grew further in the following months.



Among the kidnapped lot was mostly the girls. In the year 2019, more than 7000 girls out of 9812 were kidnapped in the state.

In the year 2020, about 73 per cent of the kidnappings were of girls and the rest were women.

Passport applicants can share documents from Digi Locker Facility integrated with Passport Seva project

Giving relief from carrying and submitting crucial documents in hard copy, now passport applicants can share their vital documents like birth and address proof from Digi Locker as it has been integrated with Passport Seva project.

Rashmi Baghel from the regional passport officer, Bhopal, informed on Thursday that the facility has been launched from February 1. She said that Digi Locker, one of the key initiatives under Digital India drive, is aimed at eliminating the usage of physical documents and enable sharing of e-documents with Passport Seva via a mechanism to verify the authenticity of the documents online. Applicants can attach the documents from their Digi Locker account to Passport Seva system while filling the passport application form.

Baghel said that the same can be done at self-declaration screen and upload supporting document screen. In self-declaration

Hilink City residents demo at Aerodrome PS

Residents of Hilink City in Chhota Bangarda area protested outside the Aerodrome police station on Thursday demanding the arrest of robbers who committed loot in the township on the intervening night of January 31-February 1.

They gave an application at the police station and demanded swift action.

According to the police, the incident took place between 3 am and 3.30 am. A group of thieves targeted the locked house of medicine trader Rakesh Jain. They entered the house after the break opening the door and managed to decamp with valuables and cash worth Rs 16 lakh.

Later, they reached another house of chartered accountant Nikhil Chopra and tied a cloth on CCTV. They entered the first floor of the house by climbing a tree. They locked Nikhil's room and went downstairs to his father Ajeet Singh's room. When Ajeet woke up hearing some noise the accused attacked him and pointed a gun at his wife. They robbed cash and valuables worth Rs 5.50 lakh from there and fled. After committing robbery, the accused also pelted stones at several other houses in the colony.

CAMPAIGN AGAINST LIQUOR AND DRUG ADDICTION

Uma writes to CM, clarifies on proposed March 8 campaign

Former chief minister Uma Bharti shot off a letter to the Chief Minister clarifying her stand on the proposed campaign against liquor and drug addiction from March 8.

In a letter to Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Thursday, the senior BJP leader wrote that there should be an awareness campaign against liquor consumption and drug addiction. There will be a discussion about it on March 8, she wrote.

In her letter, Uma said she had already written to



Chouhan about her willingness for launching a public awareness campaign in the state against liquor and drugs.

Liquor and drugs have ruined many families, and the Chief Minister is concerned about it, she wrote.

When the opinions of social workers were sought, they said there should nei-

ther be any political statement nor any pressure on the government during the campaign.

She wrote that people should give up drug or liquor addiction on their own.

The efforts to create social awareness have yielded better results than political action would have done in stopping liquor and drug addiction, she wrote.

According to some close aides of Uma, she had to write the letter, after the Congress termed her proposed anti-liquor campaign as an action against the government.

Gang looting train passengers busted, 4 held; two on-the-run

Government Railway Police (GRP) Bhopal have arrested four members of an interstate gang involved in looting train passengers, on Thursday. The Sانشي gang had six members and two of the accused are on the run.

The thieves were arrested by police when they were about to board a train at Gwalior railway station.

The cops have recovered the stolen goods worth over Rs 10 lakh from their possession. They have admitted their involvement in five cases.

They are being quizzed and it is likely that they would confess to their involvement in a few more cases. The accused would befriend the passengers on the train and would offer help to off load their luggage when their destina-

tion station was about to arrive. After placing the bags near entry gates, four other accused would encircle the bag and would relieve it of valuables. The clueless passengers would only come to know about theft after alighting from the train. Police said the accused were involved in burglaries in trains originating from Delhi and heading towards the Southern parts of India.

Pink Campaign at gram panchayats for early cancer detection

State government has planned to connect gram panchayats with cancer screening programmes to ensure early diagnoses and treatment of the disease.

Medical education minister Vishwas Sarang on Thursday said, "Medical education department will run a Pink Campaign for early diagnosis of cervical cancer, oral cancer, and breast cancer among women reaching government medical and dental colleges." Addressing a video conference on the occasion of World Cancer Day, organised by Indore Cancer Foundation and Cipla Foundation, Sarang said that connecting gram panchayats with Pink Campaign will facilitate the rural patients and early diagnoses of the disease.

"We have also decided to connect all 13 medical colleges under National Cancer Grid through which training to the doctors, nurses, and staff would be provided to treat cancer patients," the minister said.
